School Board Report: They broke ground at Harriton. Bids are due in for the Lower Merion project on 11/14. On 11/27 there will be a special meeting of the board to consider the bids. The board is concerned that the bids will be less than 1.5 million from the do not exceed amount or the Act 34. If this happens there will be either a referendum, a scaled back project or a high school built without a pool. Placement of the buses on the Croyle property is still in dispute.

Membership Report: The membership numbers 171 households which is \$603 in dues as opposed to last year 360 households and \$6,000 in dues.

Old Business – The new slate of officers for 2008 was unopposed and so by default accepted.

New business – postponed so we could hear the three speakers for the annual meeting. The three speakers were: Tim Lloyd and Bill Miller from Aqua PA and Assistant Director of Public Works, Mike Beck.
