President's Report:

Much of Jean's report ties in with Commissioner Rogers' report:

Regarding the recent **FLOODING** on Allandale Rd., the PWCA will work with Lance in addressing the residents' concerns.

CRIME. Some area children reported someone in a blue van taking pictures of children playing in Wynnewood Valley Park. Police were notified and it was determined that the owner of the van was a Havertown resident, and while he wasn't doing anything illegal, the alert behavior of the Penn Wynne children is to be commended.

VANDALISM. A large front window at Beth Hamedrosh was broken recently by youths throwing rocks. Although the area is well-lit, additional security may be needed, especially with the Jewish holidays coming up. Lance Rogers' report will address this issue.

ANNUAL MEETING. Jean Claude, Shelly and Tony will meet to confirm dates, agenda, etc.

First Vice President's Report. Tony Gill was unable to attend the meeting.

Second Vice President's Report. Shelly thanked all the volunteers and participants who helped make the July 4 carnival a success.

Commissioner's Report.
